2009 ANNUAL MEETING AND 12TH NITE PARTY... PLUS A TALK BY NYU'S JANET NEIPRIS!

Yes, it's the beginning of a new year, and that means it's time for the ALAP Annual Meeting and 12th Nite Party – to be held for the twelfth year in a row at the Stella Adler Theatre in Hollywood!

This year, the evening will be even more exciting as we welcome special guest Janet Neipris, head of the graduate playwriting and screenwriting program at NYU, and a former member of the Dramatists Guild Council and the Tony Committee. Her plays have been produced all around the country and overseas, including at Britain's National Theatre, Manhattan Theatre Club and The Women's Project in New York, and the Goodman Theatre in Chicago.

At 6:15 PM on Monday, January 12, Ms Neipris will give a talk on "Ethics and the Moral Responsibility of the Playwright." Those of you who've been at her previous L. A. appearances know she's always entertaining and provocative. After her talk, we'll take a short break, and resume at 7:30 with the ALAP Annual Meeting, during which we'll fill you in about what's coming up for the group in 2009. Then it's down the hall to the Stella's Speakeasy for food, drink, and socializing!

ALAP/ WEST HOLLYWOOD GAY PLAY READING FESTIVAL

ALAP is delighted to announce that it has received a grant from the Arts and Cultural Affairs Commission of the City of West Hollywood to present two evenings (or afternoons – to be decided later) of new plays by ALAP members as part of the City's 2009 Gay Pride Month Celebration in June. One evening will be devoted to the reading of a full-length play, and the other to readings of short works. A panel of judges selected by the Commission will choose the plays. And the best part of it all is that, though the grant isn't huge, it provides for everyone who participates to get paid (a little)!

The author of the selected full-length will receive a \$150 prize, and another \$150 will be divided equally among the authors of the short plays. Small stipends are also included for directors and actors, and each evening will conclude with a reception.

This is the first grant ALAP has received from a governmental body, and represents a significant step forward for us. The entry form is enclosed, and is also available on our website. Plays need to have gay themes, or significant lesbian or gay characters. Please read the rules carefully, and if you think you have a play which fits the guidelines, send it in! The deadline for submissions is February 28th.
