ACT I

SCENE 1: FOOTBALL CAMP (INT DAY)

Music swells in the background

LUST IS AN OFTEN CENSORED THING (SONG - INSTRUMENTAL WITH BACKGROUND VOICES)

LIGHTS COME UP ON ASSISTANT COACH'S OFFICE. ON THE BACK WALL THERE IS A DOOR AND A BANNER THAT READS 'WELCOME TO THE 2014 NORTH TEXAS FOOTBALL AND CHEERLEADING CAMP'. ON ONE SIDE THERE IS A MIRROR NEXT TO A DESK WITH LAMP ON TOP AND CHAIR ON ONE SIDE. ON THE OTHER SIDE THERE IS BED NEXT TO A WINDOW WITH SHADES DRAWN. SHOES, SOCKS, AND SHIRTS TOSSED ABOUT ON THE FLOOR.

> ANDY and MANNY are dressed in pants only, but ANDY has a watch on his arm. The two are sitting on the bed spooning, MANNY holding ANDY as they talk.

ANDY That was hot ... as usual. Are you sure you've never had sex with a guy before? MANNY Honest, you were the first. Guy, anyway. (Awkwardly) I mean, I've fooled around with girls a few times... ANDY You were my first, too. But I've always known I was gay. MANNY (Immediate, as if by rote) I'm not gay. (Pauses) It's just that I've had these... fantasies... of having sex with a guy. ANDY That sounds kind of gay to me. MANNY jokingly pushes ANDY off him onto the bed, rolling over and on top of ANDY. MANNY

I'll show you gay. Want to go again?

ANDY pushes MANNY off him and they both sit up on the edge of the bed. ANDY What? Twice wasn't enough? You could do it again? MANNY Sure. It's our last chance, after all. We leave tomorrow. ANDY (Morosely) Don't remind me. (Looks at his watch) As much as I'd like to, we have to get back or someone is going to miss us. MANNY Yeah, you're right. Can't risk it at this point. My dad would kill me if we got caught. ANDY Mine, too. MANNY I had a great time here... and not just with you. (Realizes that might be taken as an insult) Although being with you was the best part. (Kisses ANDY) Still, I learned a lot I can use back at Amarillo West. ANDY You mentioned you play on the team there. Me? I hated this place until I met you. MANNY If that's true, why did you come? ANDY My dad made me. He said it would 'make a man out of me.' MANNY That sucks. ANDY But these last couple of weeks, sneaking off with you? (MORE)

ANDY (CONT'D) (Shyly) They've been the best two weeks of my life.

ANDY leans over and kisses MANNY.

MANNY

It has been fun.

I MET YOU (SONG)

ANDY

I'VE ALWAYS KNOWN JUST WHO I AM BUT HID MYSELF, MY LIFE A SHAM I NEVER LET MY TRUE SELF SHOW AFRAID TO LIVE, AFRAID TO GROW BUT THAT WAS BEFORE I MET YOU

MANNY

MY FEELINGS I'VE FOUND HARD TO SHARE IN ALL AFFAIRS OF HEART, BEWARE I PUT UP WALLS TO HIDE BEHIND TO SUCH A LIFE I WAS RESIGNED BUT THAT WAS BEFORE I MET YOU

BOTH

AND NOW I HAVE FOUND HAPPINESS MY LONELINESS HAS TURNED TO BLISS WHEN IN YOUR ARMS, TIME GOES BY FAST AND EVEN KNOWING THIS CAN'T LAST LET'S CELEBRATE LOVE WITH A KISS

ANDY

MY BEING HERE WITH YOU EXCEEDS MY WILDEST DREAMS, MY WANTS AND NEEDS MY FEELINGS NOW AND THEN, IT SEEMS ARE DIFF'RENT AS MEM'RIES TO DREAMS NOW FINALLY THAT I MET YOU

MANNY

THAT EMPTINESS WITHIN MY SOUL WAS SATED WHEN MY HEART YOU STOLE IT SEEMS, TO ME, THAT FATE CONSPIRED TO BRING ME WHAT MY HEART DESIRED NOW FINALLY THAT I MET YOU

BOTH

AND THOUGH WE BOTH FOUND HAPPINESS OUR LONELINESS WAS TURNED TO BLISS WHEN IN YOUR ARMS, TIME WENT BY FAST BUT WE KNEW THAT THIS COULD NOT LAST LET ME LEAVE YOU HERE NOW WITH A KISS

MANNY and ANDY embrace and kiss passionately.

ANDY Manny, I... I think I love you.

> MANNY pauses and walks a step away from ANDY before responding, struggling with his feelings. MANNY faces ANDY directly and speaks from his heart.

MANNY

Andy, I've never felt this way about a guy before. Hell, I've never felt this way about anyone before!

ANDY

I know. But you want to be a pro football player.

MANNY And I've got a real shot at it. Gay and football don't mix. Not in Texas.

ANDY I wish things were different.

MANNY Me too. I do. But we have to play the cards we've been dealt.

ANDY is trying hard to keep the tears from his eyes.

ANDY

It's just so freaking hard. Will you at least stay in touch?

MANNY

Sure, give me your number.

ANDY gets up, walks to the desk, writes his number on a piece of paper and hands it to MANNY who shoves it in his pocket without looking at it.

ANDY grabs the two pairs of socks off the floor and hands one to MANNY. Conversation continues as the two sit on the bed and put on their socks.

ANDY Promise you'll call. Who knows? Maybe we can go to college together.

MANNY I'll try. But don't call or text me. My friends grab my phone all the time. ANDY How about Snapchat? MANNY shrugs in a noncommittal manner. ANDY stands and hands MANNY his shirt. ANDY puts his shirt over his arms, but before he buttons it he grabs MANNY's hand and pulls him off the bed. ANDY (CONT'D) Come here, stud. I need one last kiss for the road. ANDY and MANNY kiss passionately again. After they pull apart, they stand looking into each other's eyes for a moment before stepping apart. The finish buttoning their shirts and tuck them in their pants. MANNY (Looking in the mirror and combing his hair) I will truly miss you, man. Hey, there's always college. ANDY I wish this would never end. MANNY (Turns to face ANDY with a wistful look in his eyes) This isn't the end, it's the beginning ... The music for *LUBE* begins as the set change occurs on stage LUBE (SONG) DAIRY 'QUEEN' YOU GOT A PROBLEM SOMETHING JUST AIN'T RIGHT YOU TRY TO SHOVE IT IN THE FIT IS JUST TOO TIGHT THERE IS A DANGER YOU COULD PUSH TOO HARD DON'T WANT TO BREAK THE PART DON'T WANT TO LEAVE THE THING MARRED

THE JOB NEEDS LUBE

WE TALK OF "LOVE" BUT ALL THEY HEAR IS "SEX" IF THEY COULD UNDERSTAND IT'S SOMETHING MORE COMPLEX THEY'RE SO HUNG UP ON WHO DOES WHAT TO WHOM AND IN THEIR IGNORANCE ALL THEY CAN DO IS ASSUME THE JOB NEEDS LUBE (START CHORUS) BACKUP SINGERS THE JOB NEEDS LUBE IT NEEDS LUBE FROM A TUBE DAIRY 'QUEEN' MAKES IT SLICK MAKES IT SLIPP'RY DAIRY 'QUEEN' AND BACKUP SINGERS LUBE MAKES IT SLIDE MAKES IT GLIDE MAKES IT EASY LUBE IS THE WAY TO NIRVANA (END CHORUS) DAIRY 'QUEEN' CAN'T TAKE THE PRESSURE THINK THE TASK IS TOO LARGE EVENTUALITY DICTATES YOU NEED TO TAKE CHARGE YOUR ONLY CHANCE TO SEE THE CHORE TO ITS END TO GET IT OVER WITH HERE'S SOMETHING TO COMPREHEND THE JOB NEEDS LUBE (REPEAT CHORUS) DAIRY 'QUEEN' (CONT'D) THERE'S NO NEED FOR ALLUSION WRAP IT IN RUBBER MAKE YOUR CONCLUSION WHAT ARE YOU DOING HERE? (REPEAT VERSE 3) (REPEAT CHORUS X 2)

DAIRY 'QUEEN' (CONT'D)

DAIRY 'QUEEN' AND BACKUP SINGERS AH, AH, AH, AH, AH LUBE MAKES IT EASY

(REPEAT AND FADE)

SCENE 2: HIGH SCHOOL HALL (INT DAY)

HIGH SCHOOL HALL WITH LOCKERS ON EITHER SIDE OF THE STAGE. A BANNER IN THE BACKGROUND READS 'GO AMARILLO WEST HIGH ARMADILLOS!'

After set change, and during the remainder of the song LUBE, various students are milling about, chatting, visiting their lockers, and exiting.

As music ends, LIZZIE, TAMMY, MITZIE, and MARY are on one side; MANNY, BIFF, STICK, and DON are on the other. Both sides are putting away their books and talking.

LIGHTS UP ON THE GIRLS

TAMMY I'm so excited! Today's the day they post results from tryouts. I want to see who made the squad!

XLIZZIE Oh, come on, Tammy. You just want to see if *he* made the squad.

MARY I can't believe it. A *guy* trying out for Cheerleaders.

MITZIE Yeah, that new guy. Alan? Anthony?

TAMMY Andrew. He seems nice.

MARY He must be a homo.

LIZZIE Oh, come one, Mary. Just because he wants to cheer on the Armadillos doesn't mean he's gay.

MARY You saw the way he was dressed, the way he walked?

TAMMY So, he's a bit...

MITZIE Flamboyant? TAMMY Yeah, that's the word. LIZZIE That doesn't mean he's gay. MARY Oh, he's a fag, all right. LIZZIE Mary, don't use that word! MARY OK, OK. He's gay. TAMMY How do you know? MARY I got gaydar. MITZIE Gaydar? Huh! Remember Billy? TAMMY You said he was gay, too. LIZZIE You mean the one that got Trish pregnant? MITZIE That's the one. He had to quit school and get married. Now he works at Al's Garage. TAMMY With a second kid on the way ... MARY All right, all right. So I was wrong once. MITZIE And then there was Francis. MARY Well, with a name like Francis... TAMMY Don't forget Steve. MARY OK, OK. I get your point.

MITZIE And even if he is gay, who cares? MARY Homosexuality is a mortal sin. LIZZIE Leave your Bible at church, Mary. We've heard it all before. MARY But it's true! LIZZIE Oh, come one. Gay guys have it hard enough. We don't need to add to their troubles. TAMMY And gay girls, too. MITZIE Besides, all the best dresses and hairdos come from the gays. LIZZIE And the best music. Remember American Idol? TAMMY Yeah, M.K. Nobilette? I was hoping she'd win. MARY OK, moving on... are you ladies meeting Don and me at the Dairy Queen tonight? It's \$2.95 Peanut Buster Parfait night. LIZZIE Wouldn't miss it for the world. I haven't seen Manny much since he got back from that football camp. Now that school has started, I want to make up for lost time. MARY What about you, Tammy. Seeing anyone yet? TAMMY Uh... no. You know me. MITZIE Come on, Tammy. It's your senior year. Tell you what. I know a couple of guys I could set you up with. TAMMY

Guys? From this school? What a bunch of losers.

LIZZIE MARY Hey! Hey! MITZIE Hey! TAMMY Oh, I don't mean your guys. Just... you know. MARY Girls, focus. D.Q. Tonight. MITZIE Yeah, I'll be there with Biff. TAMMY I told my mom I'd do her hair, but I'll stop by if I get done in time. MARY See you all there, then. DAVID enters, opening a locker close to the girls' lockers. DAVID "Girls, girls, girls! Hello girls!" LIZZIE MARY I have no idea. Hmmm. Got me there. DAVID Dudley Moore? Arthur? TAMMY How was your summer, David? DAVID Pretty OK. You gals do anything fun over the break? MARY Bible camp was pretty neat. MITZIE (Sarcastically) Yeah, sorry I missed that one ... TAMMY I didn't do much. TAMMY closes her locker and turns to the other girls.

TAMMY (CONT'D) Come on, hurry up! They should be posting the list right about now.

TAMMY starts to walk offstage.

DAVID "Parting is such sweet sorrow!"

TAMMY turns back to face DAVID.

TAMMY

Ooh, I know that one! Samantha's father on Bewitched!

DAVID

Uh, sure.

(Winks at the other girls) I guess he said it too...

The girls say their farewells and exit stage as DAVID arranges the books in his locker.

LIGHTS DOWN ON THE GIRLS AND UP ON THE BOYS

DON

What's this crap about Helen trying out for football? I always knew there was something freaky about that broad.

BIFF

To each their own, I always say. She probably plays better than you, anyway!

STICK You think that's bad? I hear a guy tried out for cheerleading. Cheerleading! As if!

DON I bet Coach had a hissy fit about that one! There's no way...

BIFF

Hey, Stick. You joining us tonight at the D.Q.?

STICK Nah. I told Mom I'd take her and Grandma to BINGO tonight.

DON You always did run with a fast crowd, Stick.

STICK I thought you'd approve, Don. It is being held at a church. PRINCIPAL FINCH enters from the rear, wandering down the hall and checking on the kids. She stops to speak to a student here and there as she nears the FOOTBALL TEAM. MANNY Watch it. Ol' lady Finch is headed this way. STICK I don't know why she's got it in for me. DON I'm sure it has nothing to do with you trashing her flowers when you were a kid. STICK Hey, it was faster to walk through her yard than around the block. Until she put in those rose bushes. Damn thorns. BIFF And now she takes it out on anyone you hang around with. Thanks. STICK That was a long time ago. You'd think she'd a gotten over it by now. MANNY Maybe if we'd win a football game once in a while, she'd be a little happier with us. STICK Well, I'm sick of takin' her crap. I'm not gonna take it anymore. PRINCIPAL FINCH approaches the boys. PRINCIPAL FINCH Hello, boys. I hope you had an enjoyable summer. BIFF It was just fine, Miss Finch. And how was yours?

PRINCIPAL FINCH Oh, I had a wonderful time. Away from the pressures of... (Looks around) All this. (With a forced smile) But here we all are again. (Looks at Stick) And you, Shawn, I hope to see your grades rise a bit in English this year. I would hate for you to be placed on academic probation and not be able to play football. STICK I'll do my best, Miss Finch. PRINCIPAL FINCH Manny, I hear you went to a very prestigious football camp this summer. MANNY Yes, I did, Miss Finch. PRINCIPAL FINCH I hope that means the team will do a little better this year. Do you boys think you could manage to win at least one game this season? MANNY All we can do is try, Miss Finch. PRINCIPAL FINCH I'll be cheering you on from the bleachers. (Smiles and raised a clenched fist) Rah, team! BIFF Thanks, Miss Finch. We appreciate your team spirit. PRINCIPAL FINCH Well, don't dawdle now. I don't want to see any of you in my office because you didn't have a hall pass. PRINCIPAL FINCH turns as the TEAM says good-bye to each other and walks down the hall, talking to other students before exiting offstage.

BIFF (Laughing) Nice to see that you didn't take any crap from her, Shawn. STICK Knock it off. It's bad enough when Miss Finch calls me that. LIGHTS DOWN ON THE FOOTBALL TEAM AND UP ON DAVID AT HIS LOCKER ANDY enters, dressed flamboyantly, with an outlandish haircut. He's hardly recognizable from the boy we just saw at summer camp. ANDY is looking at a piece of paper and studying locker numbers. He approaches his locker which is next to DAVID's. ANDY (To himself) Locker 314. Right here. (Looks at DAVID and holds out his hand) Hi, name's ANDY. I'm new here. DAVID (In mock horror) "Toto, I've a feeling we're not in Kansas anymore." (Smiles and shakes ANDY's hand) Hi! I'm David. ANDY Nice to meet you, David. (Pauses, thinking) The Wizard of Oz? DAVID You got it in one. ANDY Don't you think I'm a little tall for a Munchkin? DAVID "Well, nobody's perfect." (Dialing the lock to open his locker) Huh?

DAVID Some Like it Hot? ANDY I'm afriad you've lost me. Sorry. DAVID The movie. ANDY A hot movie? DAVID No, it's a quote. Joe E. Brown? 'Nobody's perfect?' It's from the movie, Some Like It Hot. ANDY and DAVID both laugh. ANDY (Putting books into his locker) You must be some kind of movie buff. DAVID I love movies, especially old movies. (Examines ANDY's clothes) And it's easy to tell that you're not from around here. ANDY (Motions to his clothes, top to bottom) "What do you think of my new dress? Is it me?" DAVID Huh? ANDY Blanche. From The Golden Girls? DAVID (Snobbishly) Sorry, I only do movies. ANDY Oh, OK. DAVID I'm not sure where you're from, but it'll be hard finding a girlfriend dressed like that here in Amarillo. ANDY (Slams locker shut) I just moved here from Austin.

(MORE)

ANDY (CONT'D) And I didn't dress like this there. I just came out of the closet and I wanted to celebrate. DAVID (Closes his locker quietly) Keep it down. Most of the kids here are pretty cool, but there are always a few who can be a bit homophobic. The vocal minority. ANDY I don't care. I'm not hiding who I am any longer. "I'm here, I'm queer, get used to it." DAVID The Family Stone, got it. (Shrugs) I wish I was as brave as you. ANDY What do you mean? DAVID I can't believe I just said that. ANDY I think I missed that movie. DAVID (Pulls ANDY close) No, it's not a movie. It's my life. ANDY Your life? I'm confused. DAVID Oh, nothing. Sorry I mentioned it. ANDY Sure. But I could use a friend, being new and all. Someone to hang with, talk with. DAVID It does suck, not having anyone to talk to. ANDY (Sings) "You've got a friend in me." DAVID Toy Story. (Looks around and whispers) Can you keep a secret?

ANDY Sure. DAVID (Pauses and steels his courage, then looks around before whispering) I've never told anyone before, but I'm gay too. ANDY "Don't worry, your secret is safe with me!" DAVID Thank you. I don't think I'm ready to put up with the ration of crap you're setting yourself up for. ANDY Huh. I don't believe it. DAVID (Nervously) You don't believe I'm gay? ANDY (Laughing) No. Gone With the Wind? DAVID Of course. "But don't worry, your secret is safe with me." I must be nervous. I don't usually let things like that slip by. (Gives ANDY an appraising look) But openly gay in high school? In Texas? That takes a lot of courage. ANDY I guess. But I got fed up with the lies, the way my father kept trying to butch me up. Nothing could be as bad as living like that. DAVID I admire you for it. You're a role model, whether you know it or not. ANDY Don't get me started on that. DAVID On what? ANDY Role models. And gay stereotypes. Without the one, you get the other.

DAVID I'm not sure what you mean.

ALL FED UP (SONG)

ANDY

WHEN YOU'RE GROWING UP ALL YOU'RE EVER TOLD IS YOU NEED TO CONFORM YOU MUST FIT IN THE MOLD FROM THE PATH NEVER STRAY AND BY GOD, DON'T BE GAY SO NOW, I'M ALL FED UP

I'VE BEEN LOOKING 'ROUND AND HERE'S WHAT I'VE FOUND ALL THE ROLE MODELS STRAIGHT HET'ROSEXUALS ABOUND WHAT I NEED IS A CLUE SOMEONE TO LOOK UP TO, UH-HUH, I'M ALL FED UP

(BEGIN CHORUS)

SO MAYBE, MAYBE, MAYBE IF YOU LOOK PAST ALL THE HYPE GAYS ARE MORE THAN SOME STEREOTYPE WHAT I REALLY WANT TO SEE WHAT I WISH THAT THERE COULD BE IS A ROLE MODEL WHO'S MORE LIKE ME

(END CHORUS)

ANDY (CONT'D) I'M NOT TALKING 'BOUT SOME OLD SITCOM SHOW WHERE GAYS GET WRITTEN IN JUST FOR THE LAUGHS, YOU KNOW SO, I MAY BE A FOOL BUT IT ALL SEEMS SO CRUEL YOU SEE, I'M ALL FED UP

DAVID IT'S TRUE WHAT YOU SAY 'BOUT THOSE THAT WE SEE ALL OUR HEROES, OUR FRIENDS AND EVEN FAMILY THEY ALL SEEM TO BE STRAIGHT IT'S A DEFINING TRAIT LIKE YOU, I'M ALL FED UP BOTH SEE, THE PATH ISN'T CLEAR WHEN YOU FIND OUT YOU'RE QUEER UH-HUH, I'LL ALL FED UP

ANDY BUT THINGS GET BETTER FOR US ALL THE TIME DOESN'T SEEM LIKE IT'S SUCH A TOTAL UPHILL CLIMB EVERY GAY THAT COMES OUT ADDS A BIT TO OUR CLOUT BUT STILL, I'M ALL FED UP

> BOTH (REPEAT CHORUS)

ANDY I CAN'T UNDERSTAND WHY THERE'S SO MUCH BILE SO MUCH HATE OVER WHAT THEY CALL THE 'GAY LIFESTYLE' WE NEED TO GIVE A VOICE TO THE TRUTH: IT'S NO CHOICE! SO, YES, I'M ALL FED UP

TO STOP ALL THE HATE WE MUST MAKE THEM SEE THAT THEIR FRIENDS AREN'T ALL STRAIGHT NOR IS THEIR FAMILY SOMEONE THEY KNOW IS GAY THEY CAN'T WISH US AWAY AND THEN, THEY'D BE FED UP

> BOTH (REPEAT CHORUS)

DAVID WHILE I SEE YOUR POINT I MUST DISAGREE THERE ARE TIMES IT'S TOO HARD TO TELL YOUR FAMILY

ANDY YOU KNOW THAT'S AN EXCUSE

DAVID HOW 'BOUT WE CALL A TRUCE?

ANDY AGREE TO DISAGREE?

DAVID YOU HAVE MY GUARANTEE

BOTH UH-HUH, WE'RE BOTH FED UP WE EACH HAVE OUR LIVES THAT WE HAVE TO LIVE NO NEED TO JUSTIFY AND NOTHING TO FORGIVE YOU DO WHAT YOU MUST DO I'LL DO WHAT I HAVE TO BUT STILL, I'M ALL FED UP AND NOW, I'M HERE TO SAY LIKE YOU, I'M ALL FED UP AND NOW, I HAVE TO SAY UH-HUH, I'M ALL FED UP! ANDY You know you could come out, too. It wouldn't make you a freak. ANDY stares down JEFF THOMPSON who is walking by and giving him hostile looks. ANDY (CONT'D) Regardless of what some of the guys here think. DAVID "To be a Queen is to be less than human..." ANDY Huh? DAVID Sorry. Bette Davis. You've got some serious catching up to do in the movie department. ANDY I like movies. DAVID I've got a huge collection, and it would be great to have someone to share them with. ANDY Sounds fantastic. Maybe I can learn a few more quotes myself. DAVID But me? Come out? I'm not that brave. ANDY

Coming out doesn't change who you are. It just lets you be honest with the ones you love.

DAVID I dunno. Maybe after high school? ANDY Up to you. But you know... (Stage whisper) You and I aren't the only gay guys in this school. DAVID What do you mean? ANDY I went to camp this summer. I hooked up with a guy from Amarillo. I'm pretty sure this is the school he said he attended. DAVID Who is she? ANDY Come on! She? DAVID What? ANDY I hate it when guys refer to each other as she. DAVID Why? ANDY If they're straight, it's meant as an insult. If they're gay, it means they're trying to hide the fact that they're talking about another guy... Or, they're just bitchy queens. DAVID I know a couple of drag queens that call other guys she all the time. (Pauses slightly) To be honest, they can be a little bitchy at times. ANDY I'm not talking about gender expression, transvestites, or transsexuals. I mean guys who are not members of those groups. DAVID Uh... sorry? I'll try to watch myself in the future.

ANDY

(Pauses) No, I'm sorry, David. I shouldn't have snapped at you like that. It's just a sore point.

DAVID

Forget it.

DAVID smiles.

ANDY

But anyway, I'm not going to out him, just like I won't out you. But I've got to tell you, it was pretty hot while it lasted.

DAVID

Do tell...

LIGHTS DOWN ON ANDY/DAVID AND UP ON THE FOOTBALL TEAM.

STICK So what about this camp? I hear they had cheerleaders there. Anyone from this school?

MANNY Nah, but there were some hot babes there, let me tell you.

BIFF I bet. Anyone in particular catch your eye?

DON Hope you didn't *catch* anything else.

MANNY Well, there was someone...

STICK

Go on!

LIGHTS UP ON BOTH SIDES OF THE STAGE

SUMMER CAMPIN' (SONG)

MANNY SUMMER CAMPIN'... FOUGHT TO GET IN IT

ANDY SUMMER CAMPIN'... HATED EACH MINUTE

MANNY I MET SOMEONE MAN SHE WAS HOT ANDY MET A GUY OUT HE WAS NOT MANNY AND ANDY OFF TO PLAY, SLIPPING AWAY BY OURSELVES, AT SUMMER CAMP FOOTBALL TEAM UH, TELL-US, TELL-US, TELL-US, TELL! DAVID AND FOOTBALL TEAM SO GO ON, SO GO ON... BIFF WAS SHE GENTLE OR COARSE? DAVID AND FOOTBALL TEAM SO GO ON, SO GO ON... DAVID WAS HE HUNG LIKE A HORSE? ANDY swats at DAVID in embarrassment. FOOTBALL TEAM WE SEE, WE SEE, WE SEE MANNY BARELY TRYING MADE IT PAST FIRST BASE ANDY HELD EACH OTHER IN LOVING EMBRACE MANNY WE MADE OUT WON'T BE MISQUOTED ANDY HE WAS KIND TENDER, DEVOTED MANNY AND ANDY DITCHED THE CROWD FOR THINGS NOT ALLOWED AT, UH-OH, THAT SUMMER CAMP

FOOTBALL TEAM UH, TELL-US, TELL-US, TELL-US, TELL! DAVID AND FOOTBALL TEAM SO GO ON, SO GO ON... STICK DID YOU TONGUE WHEN YOU KISSED? DAVID AND FOOTBALL TEAM SO GO ON, SO GO ON... DAVID WAS HE HARD TO RESIST? FOOTBALL TEAM DOO, SCOOBY-DOO, SCOOBY-DOO SCOOBY-DOOBY-DOOBY-DOO SCOOBY-DOO, SCOOBY-DOO SCOOBY-DOOBY-DOOBY-DOO MANNY SHE WAS SLEAZY GOT DOWN AND DIRTY ANDY HE WAS CHEESY FUNNY AND FLIRTY MANNY GOT ME HORNY I STARTED TO GROW ANDY WE LAUGHED AND TALKED I BASKED IN THE GLOW MANNY AND ANDY SOMEWHERE HUSHED WHERE WE WEREN'T RUSHED AT, UH-OH, THAT SUMMER CAMP FOOTBALL TEAM WELL, WELL, WELL DAVID AND FOOTBALL TEAM SO GO ON, SO GO ON... BIFF DID SHE WANT TO GIVE HEAD? DAVID AND FOOTBALL TEAM SO GO ON, SO GO ON...

DAVID TELL ME WHERE THIS ALL LED... FOOTBALL TEAM SHUB-A-DUB-DUB, SHUB-A-DUB-DUB SHUB-A-DUB-DUB, SHUB-A-DUB-DUB SHUB-A-DUB-DUB, SHUB-A-DUB-DUB SHUB-A-DUB-DUB, YEAH! ANDY TOOK HIS SHIRT OFF MAN WHAT A CHEST! MANNY TOOK HER SHIRT OFF MAN, WHAT HUGE BREASTS! ANDY HE WAS GREAT BUT DON'T WANNA FLAUNT IT MANNY SHE WAS GOOD GAVE ME WHAT I WANTED MANNY AND ANDY THOUGH FORBIDDEN WE KEPT IT HIDDEN AT, UH-OH, THAT SUMMER CAMP FOOTBALL TEAM WELL, WELL, WELL DAVID AND FOOTBALL TEAM SO GO ON, SO GO ON... DON HOPE YOU USED PROTECTION DAVID AND FOOTBALL TEAM SO GO ON, SO GO ON... DAVID NOW THAT'S TRUE AFFECTION ANDY WHEN CAMP WAS OVER HE LEFT ME ALONE MANNY THEN CAMP WAS OVER SHE ASKED ME TO PHONE

ANDY I THINK I LOVE HIM ALL OVER TOO FAST MANNY WHAT'S DONE IS DONE THE FUN'S IN THE PAST MANNY AND ANDY THOUGH APART SHE'S (HE'S) IN MY HEART FROM, OH, THAT SUMMER CAMP. FOOTBALL TEAM exits, leaving ANDY and DAVID on one side of the hall and MANNY on the other. A 5-minute WARNING BELL RINGS signifying class is about to start. DAVID Well, I've got to get to class. How about we meet up for lunch? (Points down the hall) The cafeteria is down that way. Can't wait. I've got a ton of questions. ANDY Sounds fun, David. DAVID "Louis, I think this is the beginning of a beautiful friendship." ANDY Even I know that one. Casablanca. OK, I'll catch up with you then. DAVID leaves as ANDY walks off, looking at a paper with directions to his first class. MANNY heads towards ANDY as ANDY heads towards MANNY. ANDY recognizes MANNY as he approaches. ANDY (CONT'D) Manny! MANNY (Has to look twice before he recognizes ANDY) Andy? Is that you? What are you doing here? ANDY I told you we move around a lot. Surprise!

MANNY It's great to see you. But what's with the look? It's pretty wild. ANDY Thought I'd try something new. How do you like it? MANNY It sure is different. I almost didn't recognize you. ANDY I came out to my parents and my dad didn't take it very well. I'm not going to hide who I am any more. MANNY Still, it's great to see you. I missed you. I've missed being with you. ANDY Yeah, me too. I tried to call ... A student walks past in the background. MANNY is reminded of where he is, and looks around to before reaching out pulling ANDY to one side. MANNY Look. Class is about to start. We can't stand here in the hall or Principal Finch is going to catch us. Can you meet me behind the bleachers after practice tonight? ANDY Sure, Manny. Whatever you say. It's honestly nice to see you again. MANNY Yeah, sure. (Looks around again) Tonight. After practice. Be there. ANDY I'll be there, like I said. MANNY straightens his jacket and walks past ANDY, continuing offstage, leaving ANDY looking confused.

FOOTBALL FIELD ON ONE SIDE WITH BLEACHERS ON THE OTHER SIDE

COACH RYDELL with MANNY, BIFF, STICK, DON, and HELEN in uniform are on one side practicing plays. Cheerleaders LIZZIE, MITZIE, MARY, and ANDY in cheerleading outfits are on the other side. There is an old bloodhound lying on the bleachers.

DON is giving HELEN a hard time, trying to tackle her, trip her up, or anything to make her look bad, but HELEN is a better athlete than DON and easily foils his antics.

COACH RYDELL blows his whistle.

COACH RYDELL

OK, quys...

(Pauses, looks at HELEN) OK, team. That's all for today. Hit the showers, and I'll see you here tomorrow.

> Cast exits stage leaving COACH RYDELL alone. He specifically watches ANDY leave, slowly shaking his head as he walks over to the bleachers and sits down next to the dog, scratching behind the dog's ears.

COACH RYDELL (CONT'D) You know Duke, things sure are different from when I was a kid. Guess it's a good thing I'll be retiring in a few years. (Shakes his head)

Girls as football players? Well, at least that Helen is pretty damn good at what she does. Better than most of those boys she's playing with.

(Stops petting the dog and stands up) But a guy on the Cheerleading Squad? Now that takes some getting used to. I've met a few gay adults, but at that age...

QUEERS IN AMARILLO (SONG)

COACH RYDELL (CONT'D) MAY NOT REMEMBER MUCH BUT I REMEMBER WHEN (MORE) COACH RYDELL (CONT'D) 'TWAS NOT THAT LONG AGO THAT MEN WOULD ACT LIKE MEN QUEERS IN AMARILLO WHO WOULD HAVE THOUGHT YOU'D EVER SEE? SEE-EE-EE-EE

NOW ALL THE LINES ARE BLURRED DON'T KNOW WHAT TO EXPECT MEN WANT TO MARRY MEN NO TRACE OF SELF-RESPECT QUEERS IN AMARILLO WHO WOULD HAVE THOUGHT YOU'D EVER SEE? SEE-EE-EE-EE-EE

GET BACK IN THE CLOSET LEAVE SOME THINGS UNSAID PLEASE DON'T FLAUNT THE WAY YOU LIVE JUST BE DISCREET INSTEAD

THEY SHOULD DO WHAT I DID AND DECIDE TO GO STRAIGHT GO FIND SOME GAL TO WED THEN THEY COULD PROCREATE QUEERS IN AMARILLO WHO WOULD HAVE THOUGHT YOU'D EVER SEE? OH NO, NO, NOT ME

COACH RYDELL walks back to bleachers.

COACH RYDELL (CONT'D)

Come on, Duke.

COACH RYDELL grabs DUKE's leash and starts to leave, then pauses.

COACH RYDELL (CONT'D) We all make choices when we're young, and I don't have any real regrets. Two kids, a grand kid. Guess things didn't turn out so bad for me.

COACH RYDELL mutters to himself as he walks offstage.

COACH RYDELL (CONT'D) Makes me wonder how things might have turned out, though...
